



Cart Placement Guide

- » Place carts at least 3 feet away from other carts or objects
- » Give at least 14 feet clearance above cart from low branches
- » Make sure cart handle faces house
- » Place used motor oil in clear jugs and in view of drivers

Trash Guidelines

- » Trash and recycling must be set out by 7am. Place carts 3 ft. from other carts and objects (fire hydrants, mailboxes, cars, utility poles) with the handle towards house. Make sure carts are in a safe and accessible location. Do not block sidewalks.
- » All residents will receive a 95-gallon trash cart for automated pick-up (65-gallon available upon request).
- » Trash bags outside of carts will not be collected.
- » Additional carts are available for an extra monthly fee.
- » Place used motor oil in clear jugs visible to the driver on trash day (up to 2 gallons per week).
- » No hazardous liquids or vehicle batteries allowed in your trash cart.

Unlimited Trash Services

Unlimited trash service is available for all residents the week after Christmas and during Spring Clean-Up, which occurs the third full week of May. Free pick-up of bulky items and non-Freon appliances is available during Spring Clean-Up. You must call to schedule service. Trash will be collected in carts, trash cans and tied bundles only.

Bulky Waste & Appliances

Republic Services provides appliance, furniture and other large item collection for an additional fee. Bulky items must be outside and visible to the driver on trash day. To arrange for a special pick-up call (208) 345-1265.

Hazardous Waste

All Household Hazardous Waste should be taken to the Ada County Landfill or one of the mobile collection events. This includes items such as: fluorescent tubes, paints and stains, electronics, oil and gasoline, automotive and lawn chemicals, and televisions 27" or smaller. Visit curbitboise.org and click on the HHW tab for more information.

Prohibited Material

Explosives, ammunition, radioactive items, and biomedical waste are not accepted. DO NOT place loose sharps (needles, syringes, lancets) in trash or recycling bins. For information on proper disposal of prohibited materials call (208) 577-4736.

Recycling Guidelines

- » Recycling pick-up occurs on your trash day, **every other week.** For collection dates visit the calendar online at local.republicservices.com/site/idaho and select Garden City in the Idaho Service Areas drop down menu.
- » All customers will receive a 95-gallon no sort recycling cart (additional 95-gallon recycling carts are available for an extra monthly fee).
- » All-in-One Recycling: certain recyclable items may be mixed in cart (see list below for plastics exceptions).
- » No glass, styrofoam, or yard waste in recycling cart.
- » Leave recycling loose in cart or use paper bags to contain materials. No plastic bags.

Fall Leaf Recycling

Leaves will be collected the third full week in November. Leaves will be ground and used as a soil amendment. Leaves must be contained in large compostable paper leaf bags that will be collected on the same day as your trash.

Tree Recycling

Christmas trees are recycled the first full week in January. Cut trees and branches into 4 ft. pieces and place curbside on your collection day. Trees must be stripped of all lights, ornaments, tinsel and stands. Flocked trees will not be recycled.



What can be recycled?

Paper & Cardboard

Cardboard boxes (must fit in container)
Frozen food & cereal boxes (no liners)
Construction paper
Envelopes (cellophane window ok)
Office waste paper (any color)
Magazines & Catalogs
Computer & fax paper
Phone books
Newspapers
Paper bags
Junk mail

Plastics

Milk jugs
Soda/pop bottles
Fruit juice bottles
Detergent jugs

Cans

Aluminum, steel, tin and aerosol cans (Cans must be empty and labels are okay)

Do not recycle:

styrofoam/packaging, chip and candy wrappers, hazardous waste containers, food contaminated paper (pizza boxes, plates, coffee cups), wax coated cardboard, glass, yard waste, plastic bags, plastic bottle caps, milk & juice cartons, tissues, napkins, paper towels, #3-7 plastics (including dairy containers, yogurt cups, berry baskets, frozen food and to-go containers)



Holiday Collection Schedule

Republic Services observes the following holidays:

- » New Year's Day
- » Memorial Day
- » Independence Day
- » Labor Day
- » Thanksgiving Day
- » Christmas Day

During holiday weeks, if your normal collection day falls on or after the holiday, your collection will be delayed by one day. Holidays falling on the weekend will not delay collection.

Carry-Out Service
